

Easy Peasy Whirling Pinwheel Block 4x4

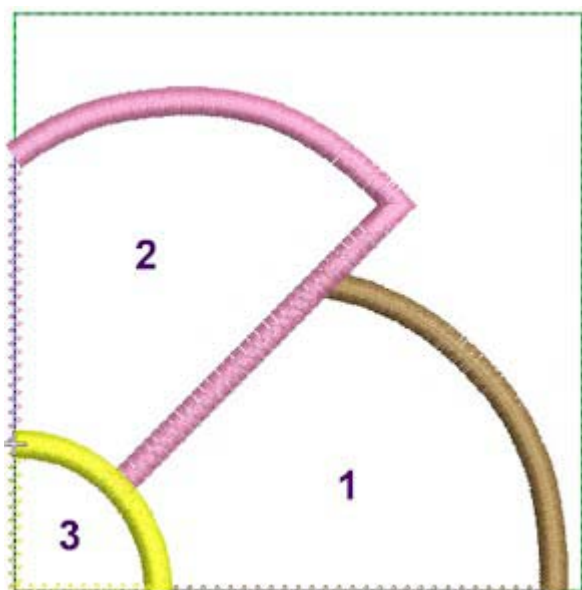


Supplies

- Tear away stabilizer
- Base fabric for your quilt blocks – I used calico
- Assorted fabric scraps for appliqué areas
- Embroidery adhesive spray – a light misting under all appliqué fabrics will keep them neatly in place
- Embroidery threads and bobbin fill
- Sewing machine to stitch them all together when you're done

Cutting Requirements

The calico base fabric blocks are all cut to approx 5 x 5 inches (12 x 12 cm).



Shown above is the **patch by number grid** for the Whirling Pinwheel block

Design: **Whirlingpinwheel4x4**
3.59 x 3.58 inches 2761 stitches

- Hoop tear away stabilizer
- **Color 1** – embroiders placement area for quilt block

- Place a piece of fabric over placement area
- **Color 2** – attaches fabric to hooped stabilizer and embroiders the pattern grid (without any numbers) for your quilt block
- Place small piece of fabric over appliqué area 1
- **Color 3** – attaches appliqué fabric for area 1 – trim close to stitching outline but leave untrimmed on the bottom edge in the seam allowance area
- **Color 4** – brown – satin border
- Place a small piece of fabric over appliqué area 2
- **Color 5** – attaches appliqué fabric for area 2 – trim close to stitching outline but leave untrimmed on the left hand side edge in the seam allowance area
- **Color 6** – pink – satin border
- Place a small piece of fabric over appliqué area 3, the quarter circle in the bottom left corner
- **Color 7** – attaches appliqué fabric – trim close to stitching lines within the design area but leave untrimmed in seam allowance area
- **Color 8** – yellow – satin border
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Remove design from the hoop. Gently remove your stabilizer. Measure a ¼ inch (6mm) seam allowance around the block. Trim to size. Embroider another 3 blocks in order to make a complete quilt block.



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
