## Cinderella Cutouts Pillowcase

### SUPPLIES (for one standard pillowcase):

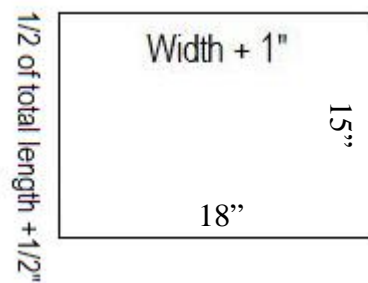
½ yd green fabric  
 ¼ yd pink fabric  
 ¼ yd white fabric  
 ½ yd pink 30mm wide rickrack  
 Embroidery thread  
 80/12 Sharp Embroidery Needle  
 Sewing thread  
 Size 80/12 Universal Sewing Needle  
 Lace for edging (optional)  
 Cinderella Cutouts design of your choice

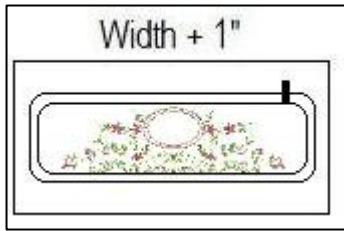
Note: This pattern is for a very tight fitting pillowcase. You may want to buy extra fabric if you would prefer a loose fitting case.  
 All seam allowances are ½"



1. Cut a piece of green fabric 1" wider and 1" longer than your pillowcase. My fabric measures 18"x29". This is the pillowcase back.

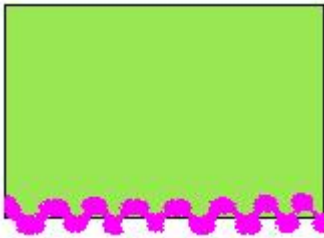
2. Cut a second piece of green fabric the same width but half as long (plus ½" seam allowance) as the first piece.
3. Cut a piece of pink fabric the same size as the green piece in step 2.





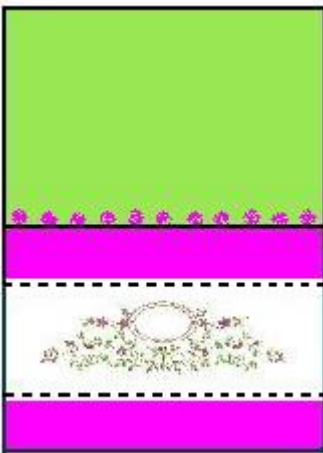
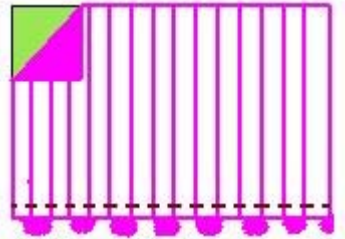
4. Cut a piece of white fabric to the same width and large enough to hoop. (You might need to cut the fabric to the correct width AFTER embroidering if you are using a large hoop.)
5. Embroider the design in the center of the white fabric following the instructions provided in the set.

6. Trim the white fabric 2" above the design and 2" below the design. Press both long edges under 1/2".



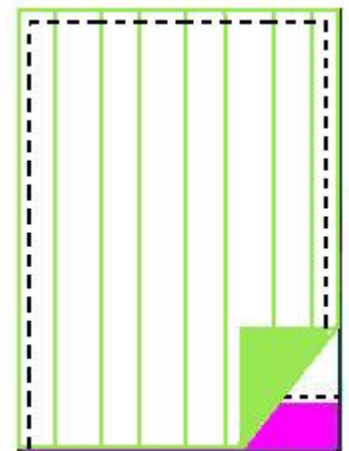
7. Place the rickrack along the bottom of the short piece of green fabric.

8. Place the pink fabric right side down on top of the green fabric and rickrack and stitch 1/2" from edge. Fold right side out and press the seam toward the pink fabric.



9. Place the embroidered piece of white fabric in the center of the pink fabric and topstitch along the top and bottom edges.

10. Place the pillowcase back face down over the pillowcase top and stitch around the sides and top. Clip the corners.



11. Turn right side out and press.
12. Turn the bottom edges under 1/4" and press. Turn under 1/4" again, press, and topstitch. Or, use a rolled hem foot if you have one!
13. Optional – sew lace along the bottom of the pillowcase, or hand-crochet a lace edging along the bottom.
