

Tea Bunny Apron



Materials

- Main: 15-1/2" x 15-1/2"
- Lining: 15-1/2" x 15-1/2"
- Flat Lace: 3-1/4 yd (2" wide)
- Beaded trim: 15" (1/2"-1" wide)
- Iron-on Stabilizer: 8" x 12"

Threads

- Embroidery thread for tea bunny design
- Sewing thread to match

Tools

- Tea Bunny Party embroidery collection by Sealed With A Stitch
- 6" x 10" embroidery hoop
- Pins
- Scissors
- Seam sealant
- Point turner
- Hand sewing needle

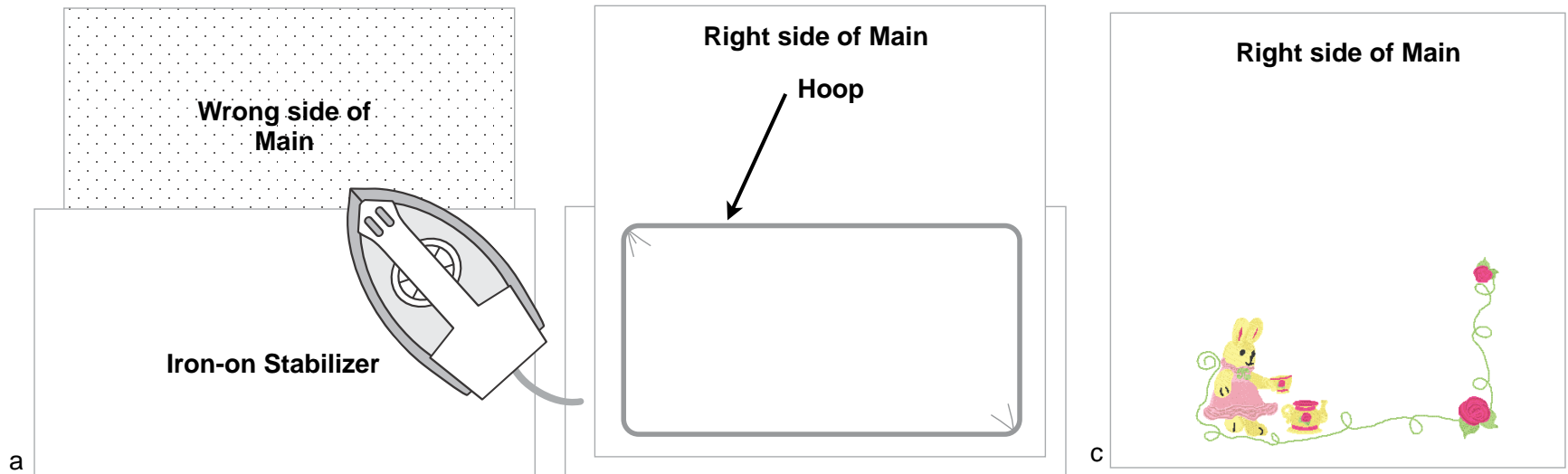
Feet

- 1/4" foot with or without guide
- Gathering or Ruffling foot (optional)

NOTE: All seam allowances are 1/4"

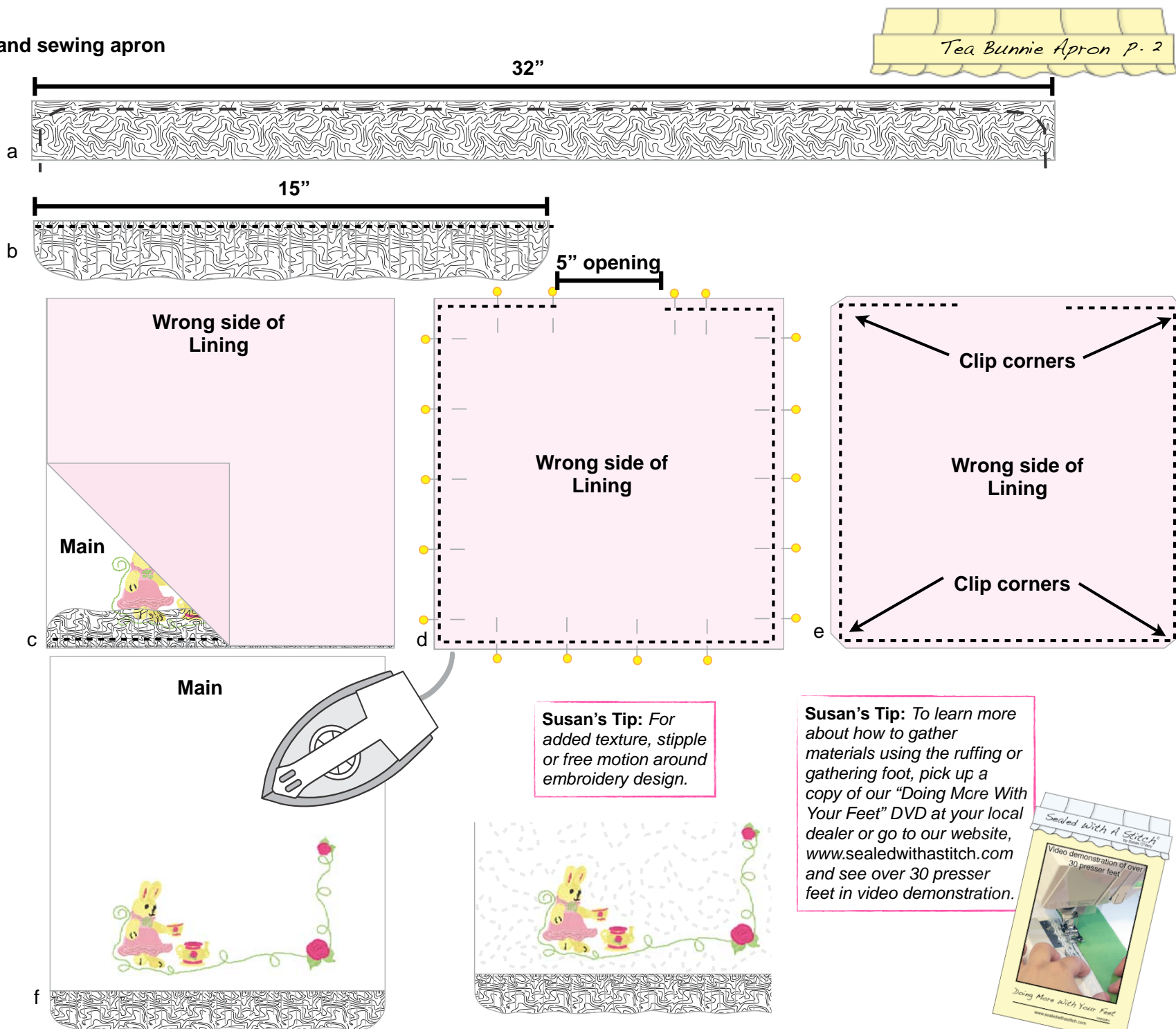
Step 1: Embroider Tea Bunny design

- Iron on stabilizer to center bottom area on wrong side of Main. Hoop.
- Embroider design. Design used in sample is the "Tea Bunny Frame_6x10".
- Once embroidery is complete, remove hoop from machine. Remove fabric from hoop and carefully remove stabilizer from fabric. Iron wrong side of embroidery. (Not shown).



Step 2: Adding lace and sewing apron

- Cut 32" of lace.
- Gather lace to 15". Start gathers at bottom of lace following curve, (see diagram) then across top of lace. This will force the ends of the lace to curve inward and leave a clean finish on the bottom of the apron. Use ruffling foot, gathering foot, or your favorite gathering method.
- Place gathered side of lace right sides together with bottom of main fabric. Place main and lining right sides together.
- Pin in place. Sew around entire apron leaving a 5" opening at the top for turning. Back stitch at beginning and end of 5" opening.
- Clip corners.
- Use point turner as needed and turn right side out. Press. Do not press directly on the embroidery as it may crush the stitches. Use press cloth as needed.

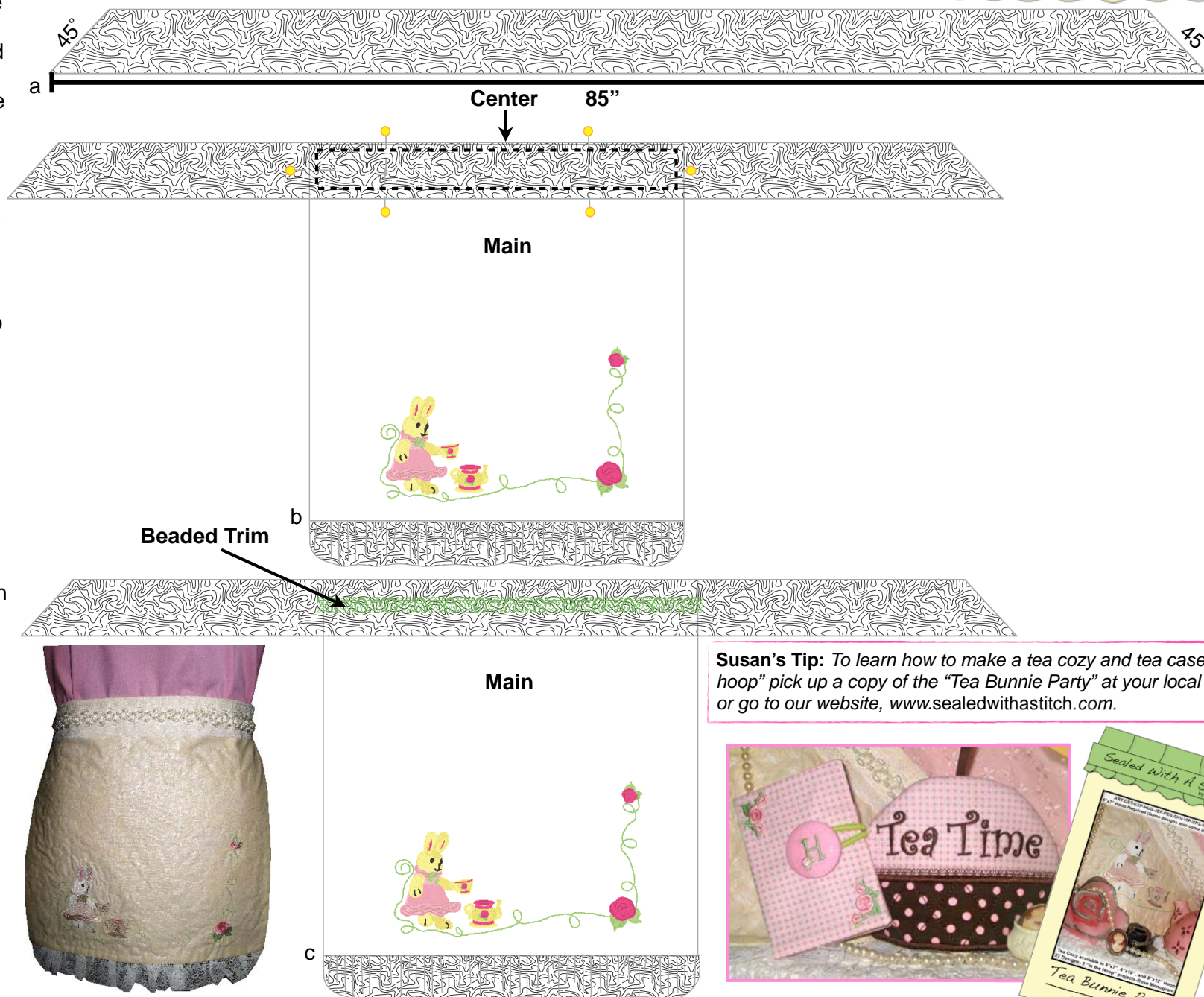


Step 3: Finish apron

a) Cut 85" of the lace for the waistband/ ties. Cut each tie end on a 45° angle. Use seam sealant on lace ends as needed.

b) Find the center of the lace and apron. Place wrong side of the lace against right side of apron along the top edge. Pin in place. Stitch to secure. Make sure to stitch across the apron opening along the top.

c) Add beaded trim down the center of the lace across the top of the apron. Depending on the type of trim selected, either hand or machine stitch. Apron is complete. Enjoy serving tea at your next tea party.
