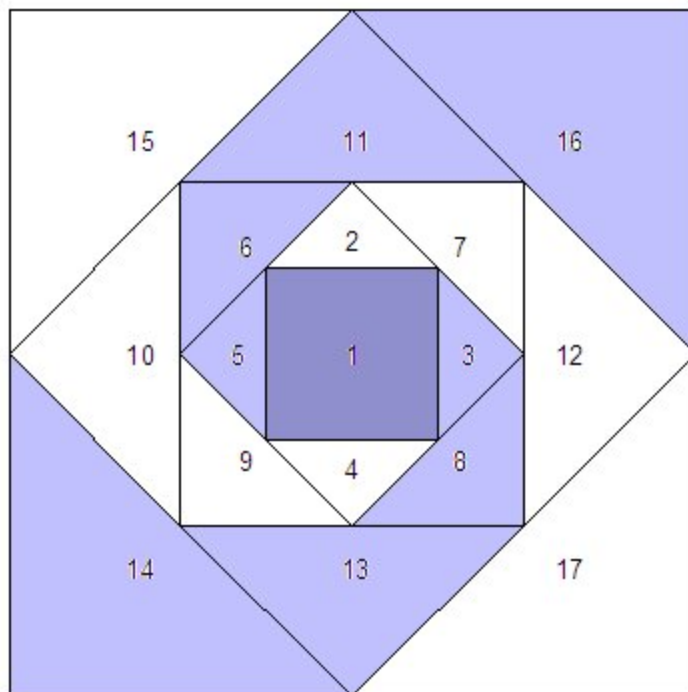


## Monkey Wrench Quilt Block 3"

1. To the right you can see the numbering and color placement chart. Print it out and keep it by you for reference.
2. Chose thread colors close to your fabric choices. You may want to change thread between drastic color shades.
3. The first line to sew is a basting stitch, clip ends and pull out if it shows.



### HELPFUL TIPS:



As with all quilting projects, it is best to prewash your fabrics before getting started. This will take care of any fabric shrinkage. It's best if you use good quality fabrics too. Some lesser brands will allow underneath pieces to show through thus ruining your block. If you plan on using your finished blocks in an actual quilt, I suggest that you use a dissolving stabilizer or a very light weight one. If you are going to use your blocks in wall hangings, as framed artwork or in other fun projects, then feel free to use whatever stabilizer you have on hand or even a piece of fabric without stabilizer. This design is based on the paper-pieced quilt block method. If you have no knowledge of this technique and would like to make blocks in your hoop, then I have a
